The Nelson Mandela Metropolitan Art Museum has not had a budget to purchase new works for the collection since 2010. The R 60 000 will go towards purchasing local Eastern Cape artists for the collection.

Purchasing artworks for a collection is a formal process and is done with the assistance of a committee of art experts selected for their requisite skills in art history and their experience of local Eastern Cape art. As the Art Museum has not purchased work for a long duration the committee has lapsed. In the new year the Museum will be initiating a new selection committee and will update the Friends and guests on progress.
