SCHOOL LEARNER WORKSHOPS

EXPLORING VISUAL ART ELEMENTS AND DESIGN PRINCIPLES

TERM 1: 1 FEBRUARY – 23 MARCH 2018

The magic of 3D: Experimenting with line, shape, form in space

Learners will learn and experiment with a range of materials from sticks, straws, paper, etc. to create form in space

Foundation phase: Grade R – 3

- Pipe cleaner sculpture
- Drawing with paper strips

Intermediate phase: Grade 4 – 6

- Paper sculpture

Senior phase: Grade 7 – 9

- Drawing
- Paper sculpture

TERM 2: 16 APRIL - 22 JUNE 2018

Order and disorder: Expressing important messages in 2 dimensions

Through paper folding and book making learners will learn about human rights

Foundation phase: Grade R – 3

- Book making
- Collage

Intermediate phase: Grade 4 – 6

- Book making
- Mixed media collage

Senior phase: Grade 7 - 9

- Book making
- Mixed media collage

TERM 3: 23 JULY – 21 SEPTEMBER 2018

Exploring design through fashion and body adornment

Learners will learn about fashion and design by constructing their own fashion accessories

Foundation phase: Grade R – 3

- Bead paper making
- Paper hats

Intermediate phase: Grade 4 – 6

- Make and dress up 2D paper dolls
- Make a neck piece

Senior phase: Grade 7 – 9

- Design a garment

TERM 4: 11 OCTOBER – 30 NOVEMBER 2018

Transforming the everyday: Recycle and Recreate

Learners will be inspired to recycle and transform found objects into Art.

Foundation, Intermediate & Senior phases:

- Create art using recycled material

WORKSHOP BOOKINGS:

Please note:

- Booking is essential. School teachers should phone and book a workshop asap on 041 506 2000.
- The school workshop programme works on a first come first serve basis.
- A Minimum of 10 learners and a maximum of 30 learners can be accommodated in the workshop area.
- Workshops are presented on a Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday during a school term from 09h00 – 12h00.
- The booking is only confirmed once you have received correspondence from the Art Museum.
- Learners are to bring their own packed lunches and picnic in the park adjacent to the Art Museum.
- Schools are to arrange their own transport.
- A school may only book 4 workshops per term.

GUIDED TOURS

Educational tours of exhibitions are available for class groups. Co-coordinators or educators who would like a guided tour for their group can contact the Art Museum on 041 506 2000 to book the tour. Big groups are broken into smaller groups for the guided tours.

Duration of tours:

- Foundation Phase: 30 minutes
- Intermediate Phase: 45 minutes
- Senior Phase: 60 minutes

SELF- GUIDED TOURS

Co-ordinators or educators are welcome to guide their students or group through the museum independently.
